

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- Council held a regular meeting September 12th, 2017.
- Prairie Roofing Systems was hired to install on the Town Shop a new metal roof along with eavestrough for an estimated cost of \$17,225 plus taxes.
- Dave Anderchek was appointed as an alternate representative for the Town on the Regional Emergency Management Planning Committee.
- The Town entered into a Construction Partnership agreement with the Ministry of Highways which outlines who is responsible for what costs in connection with the construction of the new service road on the east side of Delisle.
- The Tax Lien List was approved and authenticated and will be advertised in the "Clark's Crossing Gazette" newspaper.
- Easements were obtained from land owners in connection with the storm drain project being built along the new service road.
- October 1st will be recognized annually as the United Nations International Day of Older Persons.

ANNUAL WATERWORKS REPORT

The following is information on the Town of Delisle's waterworks, as required under *The Municipalities Regulations*:

2016 Waterworks Financial Overview

Total water & sewer revenue - \$267,388

Total water & sewer expenses - \$344,362

Total debt payments - NIL

Comparison of revenues to expenses plus debt payments expressed as a ratio –

$\$267,388 / \$344,362 + \text{NIL} = .78$

For 2016, water & sewer revenues covered 78% of water & sewer expenditures. This is an improvement of 5% from last year.
