

## FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Town will be flushing fire hydrants on Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. and, if needed, on Tuesday, August 17<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

Discoloration of water may occur. If it does, run an outside tap until the water is clear.

**DO NOT RUN A HOT WATER TAP IN THE HOUSE TO CLEAR DISCOLORED WATER!**

For the remainder of the week, the Town will be exercising water valves. This should have very little effect on water quality.

## COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council held a regular meeting on July 13<sup>th</sup>.

The Town accepted Connect Energy's proposal to provide natural gas to Town facilities for the next 3 years at a rate 5% lower than what Sask. Energy is charging.

The Recreation Liaison was authorized to apply for funding under the Canada Community Revitalization Fund for the paving of the walking trails in Harold Worth Park at an estimated cost of \$100,000. If successful, the Town would be responsible for 25% of this cost.

The Town accepted Sunrise Builder's quote of \$6,150 plus taxes to construct a cement pad at the cemetery for the new columbarium.

The Town will hire Seventy Seven Signs to supply and install a billboard sign advertising our Highway Commercial lots.

The Town accepted the lowest bid of \$457,677.50 plus taxes submitted by Lafarge Canada for the street reconstruction of the 500 Block of Main Street.

Tax enforcement proceedings will be initiated against the following properties:

The Council Procedures Bylaw was amended to allow the Assistant Administrator or the Office Assistant to call a Special meeting of Town Council if the Administrator is not available.

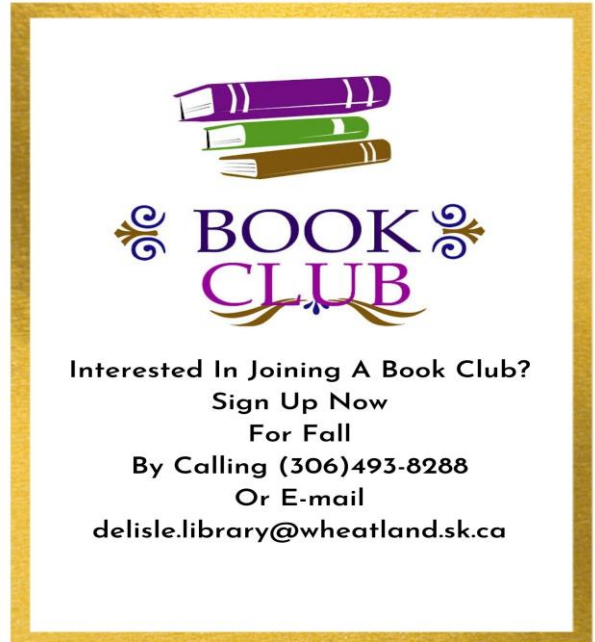
