### COMPOST

**Pick-up will be Sept. 3<sup>rd</sup> for COMPOST & Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> for COMPOST & GARDEN WASTE!**

Compost will be picked up in the back alley and should be in a 17-gallon capacity bin/can. Grass clippings must still be in an open container that can be easily dumped. If you do not have back alley access, compost may be placed on the front street.

Garden waste will be collected during compost pickup without any need to package the garden waste. The Town will collect garden waste provided it is in a convenient area in the back alley. This service is only for garden waste and only available on **Sept. 17<sup>th</sup>**.

**REMINDER!** The Splash Park and bathrooms at Harold Worth Park will be closed after Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> and will re-open again in the spring!

**REMINDER!** In accordance to **Bylaw No. 2-2009, Sec. 4.0.2(c)**, there is to be no parking on the streets with the left-hand side of the vehicle against the curb. Enforcement efforts will start after October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

### COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council held a regular meeting on August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

A resolution was passed to sponsor the Fall Fest Senior’s Supper on September 5<sup>th</sup> in the amount of \$1,500.00 and to support the request for a road closure on September 7<sup>th</sup> between 11:00am to 5:00pm on 1<sup>st</sup> Street West from Railway Avenue to 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue for the Fall Fest parade.

A resolution was passed to sponsor the Royal Canadian Legion Saskatchewan Command’s request for an ad in the 2024 Military Service Recognition Book in the amount of \$250.00 (including GST).

A resolution was passed to change the street name of “Potash Trail” to “Grain Miller’s Drive” in relation to Plan #102143464 S5 and S6.

A resolution was passed to support the request for discretionary use of Lot 20, Block 11, Plan G11 upon the condition that a commercial building permit is approved and to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to proceed with public notification.

A resolution was passed to purchase a new Columbarium at the approximate cost of \$11,200 plus GST.

A resolution was passed to add weekend tournament rates at Harold Worth Park; in addition to the annual fees, in the amount of \$200.00 (GST included).

A resolution was passed to extend the Hall Caretaking Contract attached to Bylaw 9-2023 by one year on the same terms and conditions in accordance with Section A.9. of the contract.

A resolution was passed to support the request for rezoning from Future Urban Development (FUD) to General Industrial (IND) of SE 13-34-09-3 Plan 66S24148 Ext 2; NE 13-34-09-3 Plan 66S24148 Ext 2; SE 13-34-09-3 Ext 5 and authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to proceed with public notification.

A resolution was passed to reschedule the regularly scheduled Council meeting on November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 7:00pm to November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 7:00pm to accommodate municipal elections.

The 2024 Waterworks Rate Policy & Waterworks Capital Investment Strategy were adopted.

Bylaw 6-2024 was passed to enter into a land lease agreement with the Delisle Outdoor Rink Association relating to a portion of Parcel A, Plan 102234732.

Bylaw 7-2024 was passed to enter into an easement agreement with SaskEnergy relating to a portion of Parcel A, Plan 102234732.

Congratulations to Sherry Anderson and her curling team for being inducted into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF). The SSHF has been in existence since 1966 and will have a total of 554 inductees this coming September. The SSHF is the only organization in the province whose sole mandate is the preservation of Saskatchewan's sport heritage. The 2024 induction dinner and ceremony will take place on Saturday, September 28 in Regina.

#### **ANNUAL WATERWORKS REPORT**

The following is information on the Town of Delisle's waterworks, as required under The Municipalities Regulations.

2023 Waterworks Financial Overview

Total water & sewer revenue - \$388,481

Total water & sewer expenses - \$401,918

Total debt payments – NIL

Comparison of revenues to expenses plus debt payments expressed as a ratio –  $\$388,481/\$401,918 + \text{NIL} = .97$

For 2023, water and sewer revenues covered 97% of water and sewer expenditures. This is an increase from last year due to increased water revenues. Depreciation of capital assets accounts for the deficit recorded.
