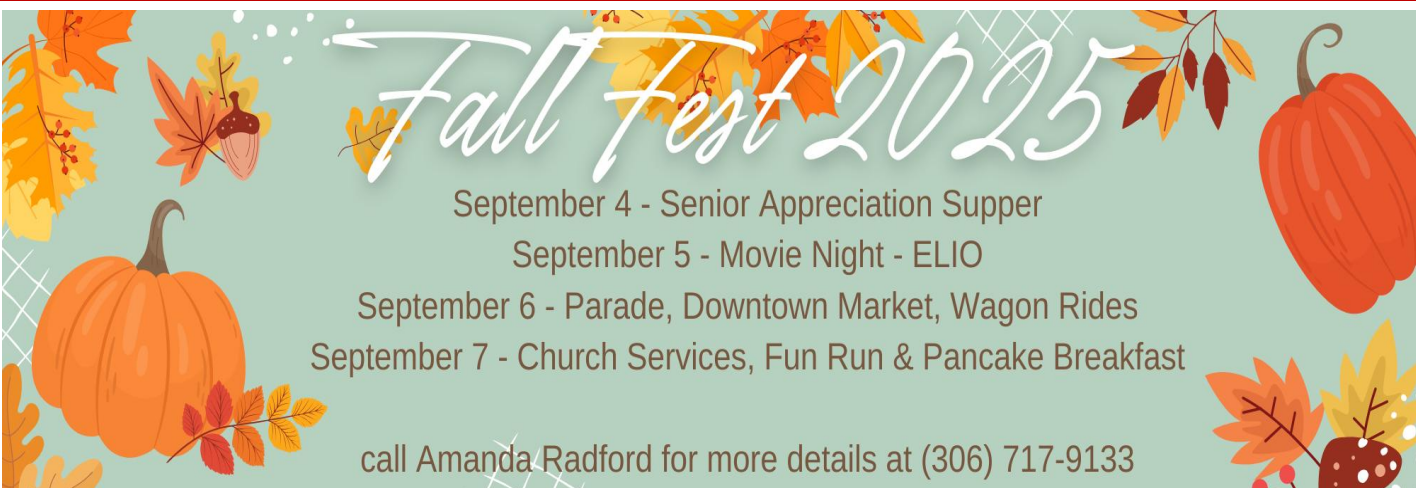

Sept. 25 – RECYCLE 	COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS Council held a regular meeting on August 14th at 7pm. Council supported the Chief Administrative Officer to proceed on tax enforcement efforts on certain properties. Council acknowledged and accepted the List of Lands in Arrears list. A resolution was passed to support STARS as per their request for a donation in the amount of \$1000.00. A resolution was passed to sponsor the Fall Fest Senior’s Supper on September 4th in the amount of \$1,000.00 and the Balloon Twister event in the amount of \$500.00. The 2025 Waterworks Rate Policy & Waterworks Capital Investment Strategy were adopted. Council agreed to reimburse Theresa Hoppe \$300 for damage done to her driveway by the grader during the 2024 winter season
COMPOST Pick-up will be September 9th for COMPOST & 23rd for COMPOST & GARDEN WASTE. Compost will be picked up in the back alley and should be in a 17-gallon plastic or metal can. Grass clippings must still be in an open container that can be easily dumped. If you do not have back alley access, compost may be placed on the front street. Garden waste will be collected during compost pickup without any need to package the garden waste. The Town will collect garden waste provided it is in a convenient area in the back alley. This service is only for garden waste and only available on Sept. 23rd.

ALL PROCEEDS TO AGT CENTENNIAL ARENA IMPROVEMENTS!	2024 Waterworks Financial Overview: - Total water and sewer revenues (R) - \$469,964 - Total water and sewer expenditures (E) - \$380,366 - Total debt payments on waterworks/sewage infrastructure loans (D) - Nil - Comparison of water & sewer revenues to expenses plus debt payments expressed as a ratio – \$469,964/\$380,366 + (\$0) = 1.24 For 2024, water and sewer revenues covered 124% of water and sewer expenditures. This ratio is not a true depiction of 2024 utility revenues versus expenses because it includes \$84,541 in capital grant revenues received but excludes \$132,360 in expenses which were paid in 2024 however are amortized over the life of the asset. In reality (cash accounting), utility revenues versus expenditures resulted in a deficit of \$42,762. The following additional information is available for inspection at the municipal office on the waterworks: - The August 14, 2024 waterworks rate policy and capital investment strategy - Capital plans in place and related sources of funding for the projects -2024 financial overview of the waterworks -Information on any waterworks reserves -At a cost of \$30.00, a copy of the 2016 waterworks assessment.
