COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Council held a regular meeting on April 9th at 7pm during which the following items were addressed:

- Council confirmed that the new roadway in Phase 1 of the planned east subdivision, currently labeled as “East Street” be officially named as “Dubkowski Drive”
- Council accepted a flooring quote from ARMR Flooring for new epoxy flooring in the Delisle AGT Centennial Arena in the amount of \$40,259.86 plus GST.
- Council agreed to renew the gas supplier contract with CONNECT ENERGY on the Wholesale Flex Plan for the next 3 years
- The 2026-2027 Delisle AGT Centennial Arena kitchen lease was awarded to Lowell Epp in the amount of \$1250.00 plus GST per month
- Bylaw 6-2026, being a bylaw for the destruction of documents, was read three times and adopted.
- Bylaw 7-2026, being a bylaw to amend Bylaw 3-2013 known as the Zoning Bylaw, was read a first time.
